



Consent to Treat a Minor

Any child under the age of 18 years of age may not be seen by our doctor without consent from a parent or legal guardian. If the minor arrives with someone other than a parent or legal guardian who is over 18 years of age, we must have permission from the parent or legal guardian that this person has been appointment by you to act on your behalf.

This is a legal document. With it, you may appoint anyone who is over the age of 18 years of age to be responsible for your child when you are unable to accompany them to their medical appointment.
